## ● HAFI Foundation Scholarship-Omega Psi Phi Fraternity-Tau Chapter

Award: \$1,000 (15); an additional \$1,000 Healthcare Scholarship is available for those students interested in a healthcare field  
 Eligibility: African American male high school seniors attending school at a metro Atlanta high school and who will be attending college for the 2018-2019 academic year  
 Requirements: must demonstrate leadership activity, community service, and moral character; write a 500 word essay on the following topic: Explain the importance of having an education? How will you use that knowledge to grow as a person today and better society for the future. For the Healthcare Scholarship: write a 500 word essay on the following topic: Why are you interested in the healthcare field? Describe a significant interest or experience that has had a major impact on your health care career goals.

 Requirements: shown a demonstration of community service in Gwinnett County; one-page essay on the importance community involvement and education have on society, and the importance your community involvement and your education has had on you; two letters of recommendation-one from a community member and one from a DHS teacher

## ● Brian Jordan Foundation Scholarship

Award: \$1,250 renewable  
 Eligibility: high school senior with a minimum GPA of 2.75 during junior and senior years who has spent at least 2 years involved in school music, arts, or athletic programs; have maintained an overall GPA of 2.7 average throughout high school; must provide proof of acceptance to a four-year accredited college or university

Requirements: must demonstrate financial need; write an essay (minimum 250 words) on why you should become the recipient of the Brian Jordan Foundation Scholarship; consideration that will aid the decision: leadership skills inside and outside of school, academic club(s) membership, social, religious organization(s) membership, band, sports, job(s)/work experience; to renew the scholarship, must earn a minimum GPA in college of 2.5 and participate in at least one Brian Jordan Foundation event throughout the year

Requirements: only one entry per poet per 90 day period; poems must be 20 lines or less to qualify, not counting the title and any spaces between stanzas; any subject matter will be reviewed; entries will be judged on creativity, originality, imagery, artistic quality, and mastery of poetic expression; selected poems will be published in the Just Poetry magazine

Award: \$1,000 (4); awards are based on academic merit, not financial need

Eligibility: seniors who will be attending a **Georgia** college, university or trade school (two year program or more) in the fall of 2018

Requirements: application must be submitted to the Association through a Community Bank Association member community bank (list is provided on web site); interested students should contact their local CBA member bank and ask for sponsorship; write an essay of not more than 500 words on the following prompt: What do you think is the most important aspect of community banking? Why? Has a specific community bank made an impact on you?; it is encouraged that students contact the bank and speak with the bank CEO or his designated representative to learn about the importance of community banking; the information gained will be crucial in writing the essay on community banking; application evaluated on high school record, SAT scores, teacher recommendation, essay and list of leadership positions, activities, honors and awards

Requirements: involvement in school and community activities, academic ability and financial need will be factors in the selection of the recipients; must submit a resume along with the application; those that meet the requirements will be invited to a face-to-face interview on Saturday, May 12th; on the day of the interview, applicants will be asked to write a one-page response on an assigned topic; at least one parent must be Jamaican
